

A RESOLUTION INCREASING THE BULK RATE USE OF THE MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS SYSTEM FOR THE TOWN OF HANNA, WYOMING, EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 16, 2022

WHEREAS, Section 13.04.30 (A) of the Municipal Code for the Town of Hanna, Wyoming (Town) grants the Town Council the authority to establish rates for water consumption, costs, and services incidental to the operation of the municipal waterworks system, from time to time, by resolution;

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that to promote business in and around the Town of Hanna the sale of bulk treated water from hydrants designated by the Town of Hanna should be permissible in addition to wells that are located within the Town of Hanna

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that the usage of a hose to remove bulk water from the Town's hydrant may result in potential contamination, the use of the hydrant will only be allowed with proper safety equipment and approval from the Mayor and Public Works Director.

NOW THEREFORE THE TOWN COUNCIL OF HANNA, WYOMING, RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the following bulk rate use of water from the Town's well shall be as follows effective February 16, 2022 until amended by the Town Council:


1. Forty dollars (\$40.00) for the first ten thousand gallons or less of water from wells designated by the Town of Hanna; and Three Dollars (\$3.00) for every thousand gallons thereafter.
2. If the Town of Hanna has to provide a pump for the well: Sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) for the first ten thousand gallons or less of water from the well; and four dollars (\$4.00) for every thousand gallons thereafter.

For Processed Water there will be a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) refundable deposit required, along with the following fees:

1. For water that is processed the charge will be ten dollars (\$10.00) per one thousand gallons.

Section 2. That bulk water shall be distributed only through the wells designated by the Town.
